Stay-At-Home Order by Governor
What Does This Mean for San Joaquin County?

(San Joaquin County) The California State Public Health Officer and Director of the California Department of Public Health has ordered all individuals living in the State of California to stay at home, except as needed to maintain continuity of operation of the federal critical infrastructure sectors, critical government services, schools, childcare, and construction, including housing construction.

What does that mean for residents? This went into effect on Thursday, March 19, 2020 and the order is in place until further notice. Essential services will remain open such as gas stations, pharmacies, banks, laundromats/laundry services, and food including: grocery stores, farmers’ markets, food banks, convenience stores, take-out and delivery restaurants. Essential state and local government functions will also remain open, including law enforcement and offices that provide government programs and services. Closures include dine-in restaurants, bars and nightclubs, entertainment venues, gyms and fitness studios, public events and gatherings, and convention centers.
