College Station is the largest city in the Research Valley area, with a population of more than 96,900 in 2012. College Station is in the “heart” of central Texas. Only 100 miles from Houston and Austin and 160 miles from Dallas and San Antonio, College Station is within four hours driving time of most major cities.
