MINUTES

Consideration and Possible Action on the Following:

1. **Call to Order/Roll Call:** Trustee Wilkinson called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. Members in attendance: Deerfield: Trustees Wilkinson, Wiezorek and Evenson; Cambridge: Trustees Cunningham, Breunig and Rose; Others in attendance: Deputy Lauritsen, Deputy VandeBurgt, Captain Tetzlaff, Dane County Sheriff's Office; Eric Wittwer, Village Of Cambridge, Mark McNally, Cambridge Village President; Lisa Moen, Administrator/Clerk/Treasurer Cambridge.
2. **Approval of Agenda:** Trustee Evenson made a motion to approve the Agenda, seconded by Trustee Cunningham. Motion carried.
3. **Approval of Minutes:** December 8, 2020 Minutes; Trustee Cunningham made a motion to approve the minutes as presented, seconded by Trustee Wiezorek. Motion carried.
4. **Public Comments:** None
5. **Reports**
 - a. **Police:** November, December 2020: Holidays were busy. Mental health cases are up. Discussion on winter parking; speed sign is back up on Liberty; Cambridge has requested funds from the Cambridge Foundation to update the sign on HWY 12/18.

Trustee Cunningham made a motion to approve the Police Report, seconded by Trustee Evenson. Motion carried.

- b. **Court:** November, December 2020 (New reports will be in place for the next meeting): Court will be starting back in person in April.

Trustee Evenson made a motion to approve the Court Report, seconded by Trustee Rose. Motion carried.

6. **Unfinished Business:**
 - a. **Police: Overtime for summer of 2021:** Captain Tetzlaff was present for the discussion. Numbers should be less, 9 days vs. 11 days. There was discussion regarding the current contract and how absences are addressed. Captain Tetzlaff commented that all of the contracts are currently being reviewed and will be updated. There will be a new sheriff coming on, and it will be an opportune time for them to be reviewed/updated. During the summer Deputy Reynolds will be back on the schedule, allowing for more coverage. Deerfield Village Board discussed using the carryover money from 2020, Cambridge had also carried over funds. Discussion of \$4,000 per community. Discussion about the possibility of additional officers in the future.

Trustee Evenson made a motion for each community to use up to \$4,000 of carryover funds to cover overtime for the summer of 2021, seconded by Trustee Breunig. Motion carried.

7. New Business:

- a. Police: Upgrades
 - i. New roof, solar panels in Deerfield- Looking at March
 - ii. Office space in Cambridge – hoping to have it cleaned out later this summer
 - iii. Standing desk – repurposed from County, for the Cambridge Office. Will work with Public Works.
