The County Executive is the chief elected officer for the county. Elected to a four-year term in a spring election, the County Executive provides centralized management of county operations and facilities. The County Executive is responsible for supervising and coordinating all administrative and management functions performed by all departments and offices of Washington County government. The County Executive appoints a cabinet to assist in the management of administration, community development, health and human services, and public works. As a community leader, the county executive's office responds to constituent questions and concerns. The county executive's current term expires in 2024.

The mission of the Emergency Management office is to ensure that Washington County, and the municipalities thereof, will be prepared to respond to, recover from, and mitigate the effects of emergencies/disasters resulting from natural or man-made causes. A County emergency management organization exists to carry out the purposes set out in Chapter 323, Wis. State Statutes.

The Emergency Management Coordinator assists in the procurement of resources that may be needed during or following a disaster. The Emergency Management Coordinator is also the liaison between Federal, State, and local government.

Subject to the requirement of S.A.R.A. Title III, Section 303(c) (3), the Local Emergency Planning Committee has designated the Emergency Management Coordinator as the coordinator of information for all records and documents submitted by owner/operators of facilities subject to emergency planning and notification requirements of the Emergency Planning & Community Right to Know Act (EPCRA).

The office of the Medical Examiner is authorized by Section 979 of the Wisconsin State Statutes. The office is responsible for the investigation of deaths in Washington County and determining the cause and manner of death in the following categories: all deaths occurring where there are unusual or suspicious circumstances; all homicides; all suicides; all accidental deaths, whether or not the accident caused the death; all motor vehicle deaths; all deaths by abortion; all deaths where poison is involved, whether or not the poison caused the death; all cremations; all deaths where there is no doctor in attendance; all deaths where the physician refuses to sign a death certificate; and all sudden unexpected infant death cases.

CLERK OF CIRCUIT COURT

The Clerk of Circuit Court is an elected position and the term of office is 4 years. Clerks are required to maintain records of all documents filed with the courts, keep a record of court proceedings, schedule court hearings, and collect various fees, fines, and forfeitures ordered by the court or specified by statute. The office is also responsible for selecting and notifying potential jurors for jury service.

The administrative responsibilities of the Clerk of Circuit Court include budgeting and administering trial court resources, developing effective policies and procedures, and recruiting and maintaining competent staff.

Clerks are record keepers, court administrators, and government leaders. They provide an administrative link between the judiciary, the County Board, and the public.

The Circuit Judges are elected by the people of the County and hold office for a term of six years. No person shall be eligible to the office of Judge who shall not at the time of his/her election be a citizen of the United States, have attained the age of 25 years, and be a qualified elector within the jurisdiction for which he/she may be chosen. No person may take or hold the office of Circuit Judge unless he/she is licensed to practice law in the State of Wisconsin and has been so licensed for five years immediately prior to his/her election or appointment. Circuit Judges may be assigned to any one of the branches.

Court Commissioners

The Circuit Court Commissioner is part of the judicial branch. The Circuit Court Commissioner assists the judges, enters temporary Court Order(s) as to custody, support, etc. in family actions, orders mediation for custody and visitation disputes, presides over and issues decisions, orders and judgments in civil domestic abuse and harassment actions, motions to revise support, final hearings in stipulated divorces, initial appearances and pre-trials in paternity cases, juvenile plea hearings, mental commitment and protective placement probable cause hearings, and handles other duties assigned by the Judges.

It is the duty of the County Board Chairperson to open sessions of the County Board; to announce business before the County Board; and to receive and submit all motions and propositions presented by the members. Other areas of involvement include reviewing the budget prior to submission to the County Board; representing the County Board as authorized at meetings or other official functions; and assigning, when appropriate, the members who are to serve on committees. The Chairperson also shall be an ex-officio member of all committees on which he/she does not serve as a member.

The County Clerk is a Constitutional Officer elected every four years by the voters of Washington County.

The County Clerk provides services to the County Board of Supervisors and the general public and acts as an agent and representative for the State of Wisconsin through clerical assistance, issuance and distribution of licenses, election coordination, preparation of minutes, and maintenance of records. The County Clerk is an acceptance agent for passport applications. Central Reproduction and mail service is provided through the County Clerk.

The County Treasurer is a Constitutional Officer elected every four years by the voters of Washington County.

It is the County Treasurer's responsibility to prepare, generate, and print the tax bills and tax rolls for all 20 municipalities in Washington County. We work with the Wisconsin Department of Revenue to incorporate the latest legislation that may affect the tax bill.

As the tax collector, the County Treasurer is responsible for the collection of all postponed and delinquent real estate taxes that are turned over from the 20 municipalities in the county. Unpaid real estate taxes constitute a lien against that property. The maintenance of accurate records of payment received is a vital function of this office. The County Treasurer maintains a central file of all tax rolls dating back to 1840s, which are accessible and open to the public.

The County Treasurer acts as the County's bank. We receipt all revenues from the various county departments and deposit the money at the bank. The County Treasurer functions as the cash manager for the County making sure that there are funds available to meet the County bills, payrolls, debt payments, and tax settlement payments. The County Treasurer invests excess cash in various financial institutions in Washington County.

The County Treasurer is a resource for the local municipal clerks and treasurers of Washington County.

Responsibilities of the **County Treasurer** include the following:

- Generate and print tax bills and tax rolls
- Collect postponed and delinquent taxes
- Receive and receipt county departmental revenues
- Make sure that County has funds available for payment of their bills, payrolls, debt payments, and tax settlements
- Reconcile cash and investment accounts
- Reconcile Real Estate Transfer fees, Fines due to the State, Probate & Vital Record fees, Marriage License fees and Dog License fees.
- Qualify properties that meet the criteria for the Lottery Credit
- Administer Agricultural Use Conversion fees
- Research, process, and serve Tax Deed Application Notices
- Provide customer assistance and referrals

DISTRICT ATTORNEY

Prosecutes all violations of State criminal law which occur within Washington County, from the traditional violations such as homicide, robberies, and burglaries to operating while intoxicated and domestic violence cases. Counsel for the State of Wisconsin on criminal matters arising within this County. In addition, the office of the District Attorney prosecutes some violations of County ordinances which regulate the conduct of persons within this County (such as traffic matters and disorderly conduct cases).

Victim/Witness Services

Located in the District Attorney's office, this program is a source of information and support for victims and witnesses of crime in Washington County. Some of the services the program offers include explanation of court procedures, notification of court hearings, final outcome of cases, referrals to other agencies, and help with requesting recovery of money losses and property for crime victims.

Under the authority of Chapter 59.43 of the Wisconsin State Statutes, the Register of Deeds is the custodian of both land and vital records. Documents recorded in the office are a matter of public record and can be inspected by anyone during regular business hours. Genealogy and historical records are available, dating back to the mid-1800's.

Items of record include but are not limited to:

- Real Estate transactions to be binding upon all parties include deeds, mortgages, satisfactions, and land contracts
- Certified survey maps, condominium, and subdivision plats along with corresponding declarations affecting the maps

Under the authority of Chapter 70.09 of the Wisconsin State Statutes, the Real Property Lister provides the citizens of Washington County with parcel based land information. The Lister is responsible for determining interests or legal rights in real property and coordination of property valuation.

The office provides seven major services:

The Sheriff is the Chief Law Enforcement Officer of the County.

- Responsible for the operation/ maintenance of persons held in the County Jail. Provides meals, medical care, and transports prisoners from other agencies/institutions, to/from court as needed, as well as, transportation of mental patients to/from institutions. Provides Courthouse Security, Bailiffs in the courts, and serves civil process.
- Responsible for the prevention/investigation of crime, to protect property and the liberty of persons within the County, and to apprehend criminals who are within the County whether or not the crime was committed inside the County.
- Responsible for patrolling all roadways/highways within the County, enforcing traffic codes, and investigating traffic accidents. Investigates all child abuse/neglect cases referred to the Sheriff, provides juvenile investigation within the County, and makes referrals to social agencies to protect children and society.
- The Sheriff also serves as project director for the Washington County MJG (Multi-Jurisdictional Group) Drug Unit.

The Finance Department provides Washington County with centralized financial management, accounting system, and Purchasing.

Financial information is provided to the County Board and county departments. Accounting activities include preparation of financial reports, maintenance of the general ledger; accounts payable and indirect cost allocations. The department works with the County Executive to prepare the annual budget.

Purchasing is responsible for providing supervision, coordination, and monitoring of the purchasing functions of the County. The department monitors the County's centralized purchasing system to ensure quality goods, price advantage, and conformance to the County's Purchasing Code. The department is responsible for disposing of County surplus equipment through auction, recycling programs or distribution within other county departments.

Under the direction of the County Attorney, the Child Support Agency obtains, monitors, and enforces child support orders in cases where parents are separated, divorced, unmarried, or when children are placed in substitute care.

When children receive public aid/benefits, the case is automatically referred to the Child Support Agency by the Human Services Department. In non-aid cases, the Child Support Agency will provide assistance to parents or court-ordered guardian upon application. The Agency may obtain an order for child support and medical support, or enforce an existing order.

When a child is born to parents who are not married and do not file a paternity acknowledgment, the Agency will commence an action to establish paternity. Child support orders, repayment of birth costs, and other expenses may be ordered.

The Child Support Agency reviews support orders for modification and pursues collection of child support arrearages through actions which include court orders, income withholding, liens, money judgments, and intercept of State and Federal income tax refunds, and lottery winnings.

The Human Services Department (HSD) is responsible for all human and social service needs of the County according to provisions of Wisconsin State Statutes 46.23. The primary function of Human Services is to create a comprehensive planning approach to address the community human service needs under the governance of the Human Services Committee.

HSD provides countywide services for persons with alcohol and other drug abuse problems, and/or severe persistent mental illness. HSD is also the focal point for services to children and families, child abuse and neglect, juvenile justice, and multiple economic assistance programs.

The **Behavioral Health Division** is responsible for administering provided and purchased programs in the areas of mental health and alcohol and other drug abuse. Acute Care Services (ACS), provides 24/7 crisis phone and mobile response. Lifespan Clinical Services offers evaluation, counseling, and treatment to children and adults by a multidisciplinary professional staff. Community Treatment Services (CTS) delivers intensive services to persons with persistent mental health issues so they can successfully live independently in the community. Youth Treatment Team supports children and families needing mental health support and services for children with disabilities, through its Children's Long Term Support, Comprehensive Community Services and Birth to Three programming.

The **Children and Families Division** is responsible for administering programs related to the protection of children and safety of the community. This division has the statutory responsibility for investigating and providing services in situations where it is believed children have been harmed or neglected. The Children and Families Division also assesses and supervises juveniles who have been involved in delinquent activities and status offenses such as school truancy, runaway or uncontrolled behavior.

The **Economic Support Division** provides financial services to low income families through the Moraine Lakes Consortium. Child Care, Food Share, Medicaid and Badger Care Plus applicants are directed to the Moraine Lakes Call Center at 888-446-1239 or online at Accesswisconsin.gov. 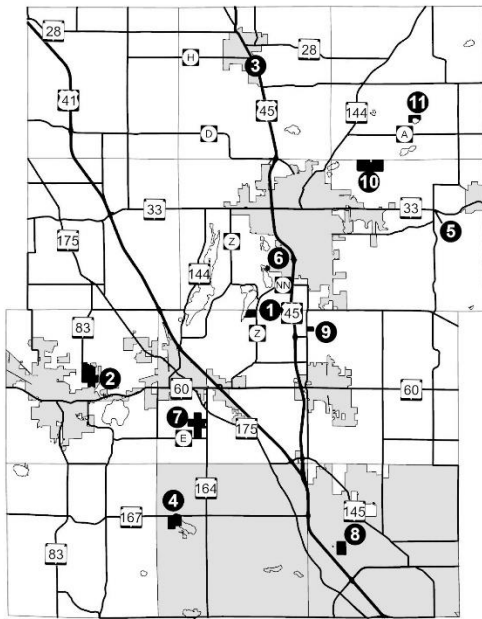

County road construction is decided on the basis of need; roads are built with Federal aid, if possible with contracts, and let to the lowest, responsible bidder.

Maintenance includes patching blacktop, picking up trash on the right of way, mowing, tree cutting, shoulder repair, drainage, sign repair, guard rails, putting up snow fence, salting, and plowing.

Transit services include: commuter express bus service to citizens seeking transportation to and from the Milwaukee Metro Area and a demand response reservation shared ride taxi service throughout Washington County and into the northern portion of Menomonee Falls.
