PROGRAM YEAR 2020-2021**

**Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act)  
COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG-CV)  
EMERGENCY SOLUTIONS GRANT (ESG-CV) PROGRAM**

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On April 6, 2020, the Fiscal Year (FY) 2020 budget for the Department of Housing and Urban Development was enacted, which includes Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES Act) supplemental funding.

The City of San Bernardino has been allocated \$2,003,529 in Community Development Block Grant (CDBG-CV) Funds, and \$1,019,997 in Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG-CV) in Round 1 and \$3,422,960 in Round 2. The City's intent of use of these funding sources are as follows:

- \$2,003,529 of CDBG-CV funds under the CARES Act. These special CDBG-CV funds are to be used to prevent, prepare for, and respond to the coronavirus pandemic (COVID19) among individuals and families who are being impacted by the pandemic. The primary intent of the CDBG-CV funds is to supplement the existing operational budgets of nonprofit organizations and government agencies responding to the critical needs of the community by providing services to prevent, prepare for, and respond to increased demand for services for these populations.
  - The City is proposing in using the CDBG-CV funds to fund an Eviction Prevention Assistance Program, Senior Nutrition Program, rehabilitating facilities at the City parks to build outdoor showers, the Grab and Go arts & crafts program, additional Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) and cleaning/sanitizing supplies for program staff in the City's Parks and Recreation Department and modifications to public facilities to respond to and prevent COVID-19.
  
- \$4,442,957 of ESG-CV funds under the CARES Act. These special ESG-CV funds are to be used to prevent, prepare for, and respond to the coronavirus pandemic (COVID19) among individuals and families who are homeless or receiving homeless assistance and to support additional homeless assistance activities to mitigate the impacts of COVID-19. The primary intent of the ESG-CV funds is to supplement the existing operational budgets of nonprofit organizations and government agencies responding to the critical needs of the community by providing services to prevent, prepare for, and respond to increased demand for services for these populations.
  - The City is proposing in using the ESG-CV funds to fund five providers within the City to assist with Emergency Shelter, Street Outreach, Rapid Re-Housing and rehabilitation of a current emergency shelter.
