The City will publish periodic reports to document completed bond projects. 11
Bonds would be repaid from property taxes for a period not to exceed 6 years. The estimated rate is \$0.50 per \$1000 of assessed value, or about \$79 per year (\$6.58 per month) for the average Springfield homeowner. 38
