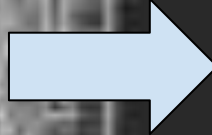




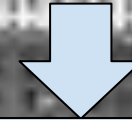
Pre-arrest Diversion Referral Process

The process of diverting an individual who has committed a Law Enforcement Assisted Diversion (LEAD) eligible offense from the criminal justice system to harm-reduction based intensive case management services. Diversion takes place at the discretion of the police officer to either file charges against the individual or to divert the charge.

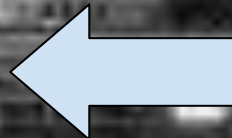
Cincinnati Police Officer responds to a radio call for a qualifying offense. Background check is completed. Participant/Victim agree to enter LEAD.



Screening and Outreach Coordinator receives referral from CPD. A warm hand-off occurs at the CPD District lobby or desired location.



Participant is assigned to case manager. Participant will complete full psychosocial assessment and individualized service plan (ISP) within 30 days of admittance into LEAD.



Participant and Screening and Outreach Coordinator assess for immediate needs (emergency shelter, food, medical, etc) and contact information is gathered to schedule full psychosocial assessment.



ISP and client progress is reviewed by Operational Work Group (OWG) at minimum of 90 days and increase oversight of participant as recommended by OWG.



Participant's needs, progress, and service plan are monitored over a 12-month period. Case management will remain in effect as needed and determined by staff.
