

SUMMARY OF SUBSTANTIAL AMENDMENT

The City of Roseville proposes a Substantial Amendment to the 2019 Annual Action Plan.

This document constitutes the City of Roseville’s proposed substantial amendment to the following document:

- 2019 Annual Action Plan; amended for CDBG-CV funds; amendments to cover through June 30, 2023

Summary of Amendment #3 to 2019 Annual Action Plan:

On April 2 and September 11, 2020, HUD notified the City of Roseville that it would receive \$417,412 and \$795,721 of this special allocation for a total of \$1,213,133 in CDBG-CV funding. At this time, \$250,000 is remaining to be allocated to activities which will be directed at preventing, preparing for, or responding to the COVID-19 virus. Amendment #3 to this Consolidated Plan is required for the City to implement CDBG-CV funded activities.
